



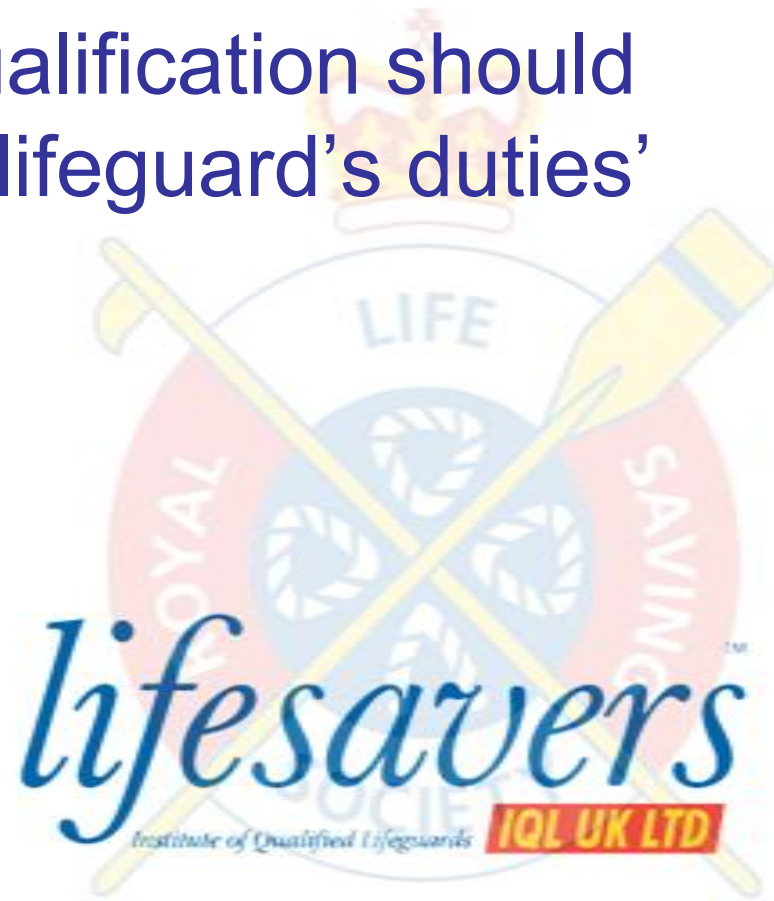

Results

	<u>UK</u>	<u>Canada</u>
Admission	5%	6%
Accident prevention	56%	47%
Customer care	19%	44%
Rescue: Land	1%	0
Rescue: Water	5%	1%
First Aid	6%	2%
Other	8%	0
